

Civil War Hero Edward Blake May 26th – July 7th

During this sesquicentennial commemoration of the battle at Gettysburg, the Judge Eghart House will celebrate one of Port Washington's best known Civil War heroes, Edward Blake. Photographs and memorabilia of his life will be on display from opening day, Sunday May 26th through Sunday July 7. Saturday June 8, the House will also be open for tours. Technology of the Times July 14th – September 1

The people of the Victorian era were gadget lovers and highly inventive folks. During the last half of the nineteenth century, many of our everyday tools were invented, such as the Domestic sewing machine in 1861. Visit the Eghart House between July 14 and the final day of the season, Sunday September 1 to get a glimpse of the implements we take for granted today, but were "cutting edge" inventions during the Victorian era years of 1837-1901.
